## Trial bids after single raise

After Opener's two-level support, first step is used as asking for clarification. All other non-jump rebids show $5+$ trumps and unbalanced hands generally with four cards in the suit. After opener's twolevel heart support 2NT rebid shows spades. These trial bids are used for finding games or possible slam contracts. In order to use a trial bid for a game contract, responder must have 12-13 FP and 19+ FP for slam try.

After opener's two-level support, responder's jump to 3NT shows balanced hand with game going values and four trumps. In this case opener passes with 4-3-3-3 and three or four trumps where he returns to 4 M if he has four trumps with a doubleton or a singleton.

## Responses to Trial Bids

After a single raise, responder's trial bids just show an interest in the game and opener responds accordingly. After opener's two-level raises, responder's trial bids can also be used with slammish hands.

## Over Trial Bids

* 3M shows minimum
* 4 M shows minimum but with very good honors in the trumps and trial bid suit.
* New suit bids show control with maximum hands.
* Four-level jumps show shortness with four trumps.
* 3NT shows maximum with three-card fit.

If Responder shows a shortness, opener can bid slam with a very helpful holding in his partner's shortness. Otherwise, he returns to the trump suit at five-level. Opener must understand that responder cannot have a very good hand, because he does not use RKCB.

## Special Developments After 1m Opener's Raise of Responder's Major Suit to Two-Level

## When to Raise Responder's Major with Three-Card Fit

* Over $1 \hookleftarrow$ response, opener must rebid $1 \phi$ with four spades and without four-card heart fit.
* Opener prefers 1 NT rebid with Qx, Jx or AQ holdings.
* Opener prefers 1NT rebid with 3-2-4-4 or 3-2-3-5 distributions and Hx in other major.
* Spade raise is acceptable with Kx , Ax or xx hearts and with good three-card fit
* Partner's spade suit has to be raised to two-level with three-card fit and $3=4=1=5$ or $3=1=4=5$ distributions without enough strength for reverse.
* Partner's heart suit has to be raised to two-level with three-card fit weak hands and $1=3=5=4$ or $1=3=4=5$ distributions, but it is better to rebid $2 \%$ then raise hearts with $1=3=5=4$ and $\sim 16 \mathrm{HCP}$


## Asking Bids After Opener's Two-Level Major Support.

Responder's use of the first step over opener's 2 M raise of his 1 M as a response to 1 m opening is considered as asking bid.This bid that is requiring information from the opener regarding his strength and distribution is used with at least invitational hands This asking bid is not used with suitable hands that rebids 4 M or hands that asks for preference with 3NT rebid. At the same time using trial bid with 5-4 distributions in search for game or slam contract as well as splinter application with 5+ trumps and shortness as slam try is preferred instead of this asking bid.

## Opener's Responses to the Asking Bids

## General Rules

* Returning to the original minor shows a minimum hand with three-card fit.
* Bidding the other minor shows maximum hand with three-card fit and a shortness.
* Returning to the major suit without jump shows maximum hand with 3-2-4-4 or 3-2-5-3 distributions and three-card fit.
* 3 H in response to 2 NT and 2 NT in response to $2 \oplus$ asking bids show minimum, balanced hand and four card fit. On the other hand opener may use the same rebids with 4-3-3-3 and maximum hand after $1 \%$ opening.
* 3NT shows minimum hand with shortness and four-card fit.
* Bidding the opening minor at four-level shows maximum hand with four-card fit and good five-card minor without shortness
* $3 \phi$ rebid in response to $2 \phi$ asking bid or jump rebid with a new suit in response to any asking bid shows shortness with maximum hand and four-card fit.
* Jump to 4 M shows a maximum balanced hand (4-2-4-3 or 4-2-5-2) with four-card fit.

As seen in the examples, 2 NT in response to $2 \leftrightarrow$ or $3 \hookleftarrow$ in response to 2 NT asking bids are used as double usage. As a result if opener or responder has 4-3-3-3 distribution, we are not losing the chance to play 3NT.

## Developments After Opener's Response to the Asking Bid

- After opener showed minimum balanced hand and four-card fit with double usage response
* Returning to 3 M , bidding 4 M or 3 NT are contract choices by responder.
* New suit is cue-bid and slam try by responder.
* Opener bids 3NT over responder's 3M with maximum 4-3-3-3 and responder either passes or bids 4M.
